Description of the possible adverse effects of the pesticides as per the Material Safety Data Sheets for the pesticides to be used:

Prosecutor Professional Max: Causes moderate eye irritation. Harmful if inhaled.

Barricade 4FL Herbicide: Irritating to eyes and skin. May cause sensitization by skin contact.

Pesticide(s) product-label instructions and precautions related to Public Safety:

Prosecutor Professional Max: Avoid breathing dust or spray mist. Avoid contact with eyes or clothing. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling.

Barricade 4FL Herbicide: May be harmful if swallowed, absorbed through skin or inhaled. Avoid breathing vapor, contact with skin, eyes or clothing. Skin contact may cause allergic reactions. Remove contaminated clothing and wash clothing before reuse.
